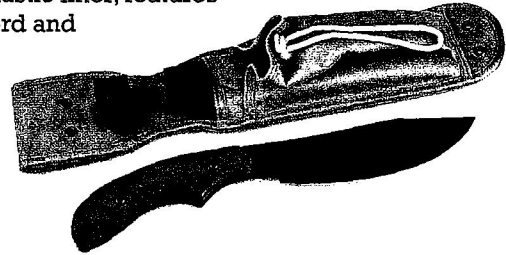

Johnson Adventure Blades Potbelly Knife

KA-BAR/Johnson Adventure Blades' new Potbelly knife employs weight-forward balance, a heavy blade and a deep belly to provide significant chopping power for a variety of camp chores. It features a 7 1/8"-long, 1/4"-thick 1095 steel blade with a 56-58 HRC rating that is hollow-ground and powder-coated for corrosion resistance. The textured, 5 1/2" handle features a 1" palm swell. An included Cordura sheath, with an interior plastic liner, features a compartment cinched by paracord and a cordlock, an extra, smaller sheath designed for an Adventure Piggyback knife, along with MOLLE-compatible webbing on the back side. 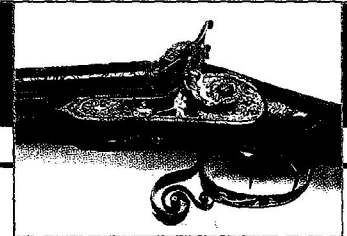
